WHO? Our Mission: Grassroots and volunteer-powered, with your help OFDC empowers women through collaborations with women-focused charities and training; educates children with school sponsorship and the giving of desks to rural schools; and enhances health for all with the funding of water wells and latrines (villagers providing 20% of the costs, your OFDC donation providing the remaining 80%). Our model is mutual collaboration – dedicated, skilled and heart-felt volunteers from both sides of the ocean learning from each other.

WHY? Consider these statistics from the United Nations Development Program:

- 1 out of 3 people in the world lack basic sanitation
- 1 out of 6 people in the world cannot write their own name
- 1 out of 6 people in the world live on less than \$1 a day
- 1 out of 6 people in the world do not have access to clean water
- Every 30 seconds a child in Africa dies from malaria

WHAT/WHERE/WHEN/HOW/HOW MANY? We put your 2014 donations to work in Kenya:

- **Empower Women:** An **untold number (estimated at over 3,000)** of women, and their families, living in Olonturoto village and beyond now have access to safe and continued access to school, hospital and market. No longer are their lives endangered when the banks of the Siyaipei River swells and their bridge of fallen logs is washed out.
- **Educate Children:** **192** scholarships and/or uniforms were given to primary, secondary and college students – mostly girls & AIDS orphans. **6** students graduated from primary and secondary school, **1** young lady is sponsored in college and **2** received KEF bridge scholarships. **6** schools received improvements of **310** school desks.
- **Enhance Health for All:** Over **827** children have access to clean water at their schools due to OFDC donors funding **4** rain water catchment schemes (parents provide 20% of costs and unskilled labor). Those **827** children also have improved sanitation at their schools due to OFDC donors funding **12** latrines (parents provide 20% of costs and unskilled labor). **1,000** condoms were given to the HIV/AIDS clinic and hospital in Narok, and pubs.



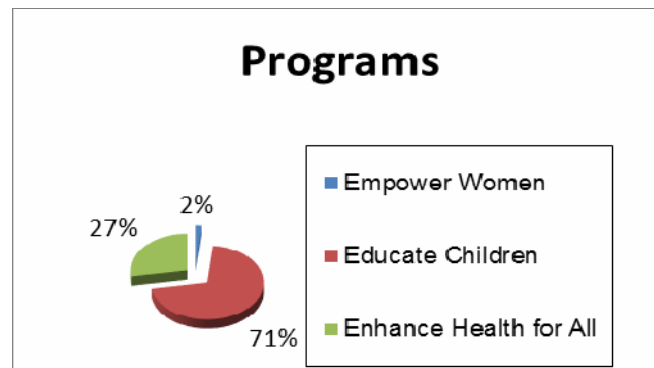
